### SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

For the progress period noted above, SJAFCA continued with the first round of Small Group Meetings to interested parties in the Planning Area. The twelfth initial Small Group Meeting was held in July 2013. These meetings presented the background, purpose, and objectives of the Regional Flood Management Plan (RFMP). Input was solicited from attendees on what vulnerabilities existed with their flood control facilities, and where previous studies on their system could be found.

Based on input and feedback received at the first round of small group meetings, the Introduction, Regional Setting, and Assessment of Without-Project Hazards sections of the Lower San Joaquin River and Delta South RFMP were started.

A meeting was held with stakeholders to discuss the Paradise Cut Widening project, and the first coordination meeting between the Upper, Middle, and Lower San Joaquin River RFMPs' leads was held in July.

An update to stakeholders was presented at the July TAC meeting. The RFMP is on schedule and within budget.

### Issues or concerns that affect the schedule or budget

No issues or concerns arose during this progress period. Overall the project is on schedule and within budget.

### **COST INFORMATION**

There are no changes to the total costs presented in the original budget. See attached Expenditure Summary for the billing period through July 31, 2013 (Attachment 1). For an itemized cost breakdown by task, please refer to invoices submitted for July 2013 (Exhibit A).

At this time we have spent approximately 12% of our budget, which is consistent with the amount of work completed on the RFMP thus far. Projected expenditures is approximately 5% of the budget for the next monthly reporting period.

### Work-In-Kind Expenditures

Work-In-Kind (WIK) expenditures are being accrued by various local participating agencies. However, SJAFCA has not received all of the participants' WIK costs as of the date of this progress report. See attached In-Kind Costs Tracking Summary for the

period from 3/7/2013 through 7/31/2013 (Attachment 2). WIK costs are tabulated and reported as they are received. For those participants who indicated that they are not compensated for their participation, hours spent are being noted and tracked.

### SCHEDULE INFORMATION

We are currently meeting the schedule included with grant application. The Lower San Joaquin River Feasibility Study's Hydrology/Hydraulics information has been delayed until September 2013, but we still anticipate meeting the original schedule.
